## APPLICATION FOR INCORPORATION OF A CORPORATION WITHOUT SHARE CAPITAL UNDER PART II OF THE CANADA CORPORATIONS ACT

TO: The Minister of Industry Canada

I

The undersigned hereby apply to the Minister of Industry Canada for the grant of a charter by letters patent under the provisions of Part II of the *Canada Corporations Act* constituting the undersigned, and such others as may become members of the Corporation thereby created, a body corporate and politic under the name of:

## CANADIAN SOCIETY FOR HORTICULTURAL SCIENCE/ LA SOCIÉTÉ CANADIENNE DE SCIENCE HORTICOLE

The undersigned have satisfied themselves and are assured that the proposed name under which incorporation is sought is not the same or similar to the name under which any other company, society, association or firm in existence is carrying on business in Canada or is incorporated under the laws of Canada or any province thereof or so nearly resembles the same as to be calculated to deceive, and that it is not a name which is otherwise on public policy grounds objectionable.

The said applicants will be the first directors of the Corporation.

The objects of the Corporation are:

- to promote and foster horticultural science in Canada.
- 2. to provide members with the opportunity to report and discuss new discoveries, concepts and practices in the horticultural arts and sciences.
- 3. to contribute to the archival record of the history of and knowledge about horticultural science in Canada.

- to provide an unbiased professional voice in the development of public policy relating to horticultural science and technology in Canada.
- 5. to promote professional networking between and among horticulture sub-disciplines.
- 6. for the above objects, and as incidental and ancillary thereto, to exercise any of the powers as prescribed by the Canada Corporations Act, or by any other statutes or laws from time to time applicable, except where such power is contrary to the statutes or common law relating to charities, and in particular, without limiting the generality of the foregoing:
  - (a) To accumulate from time to time part of the fund or funds of the Corporation and income therefrom subject to any statutes or laws from time to time applicable.
  - (b) To invest and re-invest the funds of the Corporation in such manner as determined by the directors, and in making such investments, the directors shall not be limited to investments authorized by law for Trustees, provided such investments are reasonable, prudent and sagacious under the circumstances and do not constitute, either directly or indirectly, a conflict of interest.
  - (c) To solicit and receive donations, bequests, legacies and grants, and to enter into agreements, contracts and undertakings incidental thereto.
  - (d) To acquire, by purchase, contract, donation, legacy, gift, grant, bequest or otherwise, any personal property and to enter into and carry out any agreements, contracts or undertakings incidental thereto, and to sell, dispose of any convey the same, or any part thereof, as may be considered advisable.

In accordance with Section 65 of the Canada Corporations Act, it is provided that, when authorized by by-law, duly passed by the board of directors and sanctioned by two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast by the ordinary members at a special meeting of the members duly called for considering the by-law, the directors of the Corporation may, from time to time:

- (a) borrow money upon the credit of the Corporation;
- (b) limit or increase the amount to be borrowed;
- (c) issue debentures or other securities of the Corporation;
- (d) pledge or sell such debentures or other securities for such sums and at such prices as may be deemed expedient; and
- (e) secure any such debenture, or other securities, or any other present or future borrowing or liability of the Corporation, by mortgage, hypothec, charge or pledge of all or any currently owned or subsequently acquired real and personal, movable and immovable, property of the Corporation, and the undertaking and rights of the Corporation.

- (e) To acquire by purchase, lease, devise, gift or otherwise, real property, and to hold such real property or interest therein necessary for the actual use and occupation of the Corporation or for carrying on its undertaking, and, when no longer so necessary, to sell, dispose of and convey the same or any part thereof.
- (f) To employ and pay such assistants, clerks, agents, representatives and employees, and to procure, equip and maintain such offices and other facilities and to incur such reasonable expenses, as may be necessary, provided that the Corporation shall not pay any remuneration to a director in any capacity whatsoever.
- (g) To co-operate, liaise, and contract with other organizations, institutions or agencies which carry on similar objects to that of the Corporation.

The operations of the Corporation may be carried on throughout Canada and elsewhere.

It is specifically provided that in the event of dissolution or winding-up of the Corporation, all its remaining assets after payment of its liabilities shall be distributed to one or more not-for-profit organizations in Canada with similar objects.

Any such by-law may provide for the delegation of such powers by the directors to such officers or directors of the Corporation to such extent and in such manner as may be set out in the by-law.

Nothing herein limits or restricts the borrowing of money by the Corporation on bills of exchange or promissory notes made, drawn, accepted or endorsed by or on behalf of the Corporation.

## VIII

The by-laws of the Corporation shall be those filed with the application for letters patent until repealed, amended, altered or added to.

## IX

The Corporation is to carry on its operations without pecuniary gain to its members and any profits or other accretions to the Corporation are to be used in promoting its objects.
