Dr. Khanizadeh recently received the best professional and business award received during the FEZANA annual meeting in NY in July 2012.

Dr. Khanizadeh is a research scientist who was working at AAFC, CRDH, QC., affiliated also with University of Guelph and McGill as assistant and adjunct professor. He recently accepted a position as Spring Wheat Breeder at ECORC after 22 years of research on fruit crops genetics and breeding. He has released 11 new strawberry lines and 2 red flowering day neutral for home gardeners. He also released 10 new apple cultivars including 'Eden' a non-browning apple and 'Diva' for ice-cider production and 16 dwarf rootstocks.

Journal Statistics, 2011 (Volume 91, number 1-6)

The following tables (1-6) give an overview of CJPS during 2011. During 2011 a total of 285 manuscripts were submitted to CJPS, which is more than previous years (247, 194, 231, 209 and 238), for 2010, 2009, 2008, 2007 and 2006 respectively).

It is anticipated that the number of submissions will be similar to or slightly higher in 2012, compared to 2011.

To date (Nov 5 2012) we have processed about 261 MS of which 33 were submitted under the Plant Canada 2011 special issue, 16 were cultivar descriptions, 13 were Reviews and 16 were Short communications.

Information is based on original manuscripts whose submission date is on or after Jan 1, 2012 to date.

Out of 10 review papers, 8 were accepted in 2011 which is slightly lower compared to 2010 (10).

The rejection rate for all submissions in 2011 (45%) was slightly lower compared to previous years (49%).

The processing time in 2011 for individual AE varies from 75 to 225 days for accepted MS and from 19 to 231 for those rejected by AEs (Table 4). In 2011, the EIC took the liberty to make decisions for those AEs who were late (Table 4) and an email was sent to those AEs reminding them of their responsibility and possible replacement by a new AE if they are not able to fulfill their duty.

Sixty-nine MS were rejected by the EIC without review, which accounts for 21% of submitted MS (Table 3).

Average processing time for accepted MS with final decision was 132, and 54 days for rejected MS, which is much lower than 2010 (171 days for accepted and 98 days for rejected).

Forty-two percent (42%) of the MS were from Canada compared to 45% in 2011, and 4% were from USA which is the same as 2010 (4%). (Table 2)

Fifty-four percent (54%) of the MS came from outside North America, which is slightly higher than 2010 (50%).

Along with this report, I would like to express my sincere thanks to the executives of the CSA, CSHS, CWSS and AIC for their support and assistance and last but not the least, I sincerely thank Tim Fenton and Laurie Scott for their help throughout 2011.

It was a pleasure working with them.

It is also my pleasure to acknowledge the outstanding, dedicated and volunteer contribution of Dr. Ali Navabi and Dr. K. Peter Pauls as Guest Editors during 2011 to date who reviewed the submitted MS for the Special issue 'Plant Adaptation to Environmental Change' (Vol 92, Number 6) with genuine interest and enthusiasm.

Plants are unique organisms. They can produce sugars just from sunlight, carbon dioxide and water. This ability to directly synthesize their own food has enabled plants to successfully colonise, adapt to, and diversify within almost every niche on the planet and biologists estimate the total number of plant species to be about 250,000. Scientific institutions, universities, botanical gardens, and museums, together with farmers and companies organised events in 2012 and will open their doors again or first time, with a variety of plant-based events for all interested people from toddlers to grandparents.

Northern Food Security - The Greenhouse Solution

On November 7-8, 2012 in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, the University of Saskatchewan's International Centre for Northern Governance and Development, in collaboration with the UArctic Thematic Network on Food Security and the Vineland Research and Innovation Centre hosted a conference on Improving Food Security in the North: A Workshop on Sustainable Northern Greenhouses.

The conference was initiated by Dr. Karen Tanino, a plant abiotic stress physiologist in the Department of Plant Sciences, University of Saskatchewan.

Increasing local food production is a global movement and it is particularly of interest in Northern Canada. In the north, food prices are very high, with an unreliable supply and a reliance on processed rather than fresh food. Locally grown food would increase the food security of these communities, may decrease reliance on government subsidies and provide local jobs. Outcomes of the workshop were: the need for training and education in food production, community involvement and ownership, implementation of sustainable energy sources and a network database. As food prices are already so extraordinarily high local food production using sustainable production methods may be viable.

The workshop was sold out with about 100 attendees from every province and territory plus Alaska.
